The statue of St Bartholomew located in the right transept of Milan Cathedral is a sculpture of the saint holding his own skin. It was made by Marco d'Agate in 1562

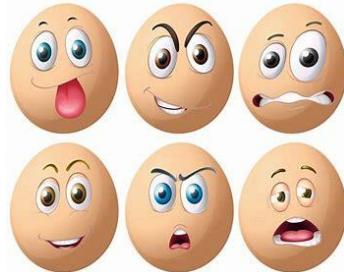




QUIZ QUESTION

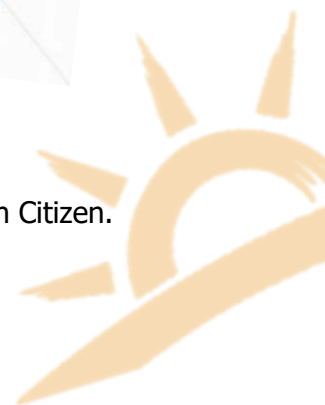

At the same time, participants are interacting with peers from different backgrounds, and different parts of our district, improving their teamwork skills and having fun!! All this done in an informal atmosphere, where questions and debates are encouraged.

RYLA and RYPEN are run annually and young people within our community are encouraged to apply to your local Rotary Club to take part in either Rotary Youth programs.

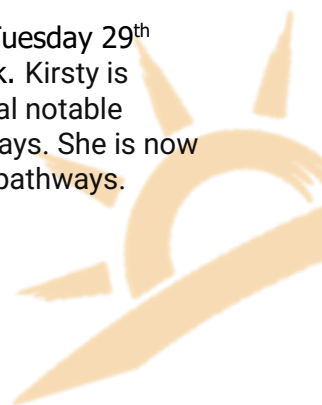


COMBINED SERVICE CLUBS DINNER – 29AUG23

As you would be aware the 2024 Rotary District Conference is being held in Loxton from 15th -17th March next year. This is shaping up to be a great event, with a variety of amazing Speakers, and great Riverland hospitality. The location is a great tourist destination on the magnificent Murray River and provides a wonderful opportunity to enjoy and explore the beautiful Riverland sights, great hospitality of the wine and food industries as well as other local goods & activities. It also provides an opportunity for Rotarians and partners from 90 Clubs across District 9510, to enjoy fellowship, sharing of ideas, and showcase their various Rotary Projects & activities that make a difference in the lives of others.

Registration - I encourage Members to Register early by checking out the Conference website (<https://2024loxtan.au/>) There are various incentives each month if you Register within that month. These incentives will be shown on the website. (Our first winner had their registration fees refunded).

Accommodation - It is also important to book your accommodation early – as there are other major events taking place in the Riverland at the same time – so demand on accommodation is at a premium. Details of a huge range of available accommodation options can be found on the Conference website

The Rotary Showcase - is a valuable opportunity for Clubs to promote the work that you do, by participating in the Showcase and displaying a project or achievement that your Club is involved in. There is no cost to participate, however Registration is required. This is a simple process of completing the application form which can be found in the Conference website. Opportunities such as this can open doors, and encourage clubs to acknowledge the work they do and share ideas or create connections. We still have 30 places available.

Soapbox - is a six - minute opportunity to speak about a key project or event that clubs are involved with. There are a few places left, so please book early. The simple application form is on the Conference website.

Club Banners - As part of the Conference activities, I am inviting each Club to bring along a "free standing" Banner (or two) that represents your Club, or its special activities. These Banners will be used as part of the display alongside the stage for the duration of the Conference. These will need to be onsite at the Precinct Venue, by 4.00pm on Friday 15th March. Please could any club that participates in this, contact me beforehand to confirm.
