GUEST SPEAKER: ALISON LYNCH – "BEHIND THE BADGE"

In lieu of a guest speaker, relatively new club member, Alison Lynch (AKA Gypsy), presented the traditional 'Behind the Badge' address to club members and guests.



Alison grew up in the heart land of the Graetz family, in the small town of Keyneton (there were 13 Graetz families) and at one stage there was a Graetz Town. Keyneton is also the home of Henschke Wines, which on the north-eastern side of the Barossa Valley as you head towards Swan Reach. Alison was one of three girls, so dad gave them nicknames of Fred, Bert and Sam (Alison was Bert).

After completing high school, Alison worked at Saltram Wines and Grant Burge Wines in Admin/Finance. Married at age 21 and separated at age 26, Alison moved to the city, where she landed a job with SA Netball Assoc. when they moved to the new stadium at Mile End.

At this time 2 SA teams (Thunderbirds and Ravens) entered the national league. From Netball, Alison worked for SA Scouting Assoc. where she ran weekend events for the kids.

Alison also fitted in working at the Birdsville Races for four years. Love tugged at the heart strings and Alison move to Mudgee, NSW for 2 years, but the country life was not for her.

Upon her return Alison worked a for a quango, linked to Local Government, Public Sector, Public Safety, Correctional Services and SA Water. Her work even took her to Auckland and a tour of Correctional Services (only reinforcing her fondness of Crime Shows). At some time in 2016/17, Alison made a return to SA Netball.

Alison joined the Rotary Club of Kent Town, remaining with the club for 5 years. During that time the club took 2 containers (Donations in Kind) to Cambodia. Political unrest in that country meant they could not supervise the distribution, but painted hospital beds until their departure.

Redundancy meant another job change working for and Aged Care consultancy company, where she stayed for 9 years. When the boss retired, she faced another job change. Alison now works for SA Produce Market, Pooraka in the Finance Dept. Ten thousand pass through the market each week and it has an annual turnover of \$615M. The Produce Market also runs the Gepps Cross Trash and Treasure, with 6,000 visitors on Sundays.

Alison has always had a love of music, singing and musical instruments. After having a crack at various forms of singing Alison settled on Jazz and is a devotee of Michael Bublé. Alison also has a love for Theatre and is a volunteer for the Metropolitan Musical Theatre Company.

Alison is married to Allan, and they have been together for 12 years. Marriage has put an end to Alison peripatetic ways, but not her love of travel. Alison and Allan have had numerous overseas trips, mainly to Asia, as well as a few cruises. They have just purchased a caravan, ready for more adventures.
