### PRESIDENT'S REPORT

The big events keep coming! And it's worth noting Magill Sunrise members strong support for SAVING LIVES.

In October, we held our second *Lift The Lid Walk* in partnership with Campbelltown Rotary Club. This raised awareness of the extent and impact of mental health issues in our community - and raised \$10,000 that will go entirely into mental health research.

In November, over half our club members (along with as many family and friends) joined with over 1,000 others as part of the *Rotary Says No to Domestic Violence* program.

In the days before this event, five women lost their lives to a current or past partner, emphasising this is a crisis that demands our attention and support for organisations providing domestic violence services.

December started with an update on the roll-out and role of Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs). Frank Pangallo detailed SA's ground-breaking AED legislation – and reinforced the role that Magill Sunrise Rotary and other Area 8 clubs can play in partnership with *Heart of the Nation* to improve outcomes for people in our community.

## **GUEST SPEAKER:** Hon. Frank Pangallo MLC



Guest speaker MLC Frank Pangallo spoke to us on his crusade to make Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs) easily accessible to most South Australians. Frank was prompted to propagate AEDs by the untimely death of Andrew Rehn, who laying dying 5 minutes from the QEH and having to wait 42 minutes before the arrival of an ambulance. The closest person trained in the use of an AED and able to **locate an AED unit** may well have saved Mr Rehn's life.

All of this fits nicely together with the work of Rotary and Heart of the Nation.

The driving force behind Heart of the Nation is Greg Page, former **Yellow** Wiggle, who's public cardiac arrest prompted him to want to save the lives of others, just as his was saved by the prompt application of a defibrillator.

Now add the work of the Rotary Club of Strathalbyn, which supports **Heart of the Nation**. Strathalbyn's works has now spilled over to become **adopted by many clubs in District 9510**, with an aim to make the SA public aware of the location of every AED.

Frank uses Greg Page's status as a door opener and attention getter, especially for Parliamentarians.

**Coles** stores have rolled out AEDs and **report** that, nationwide, they save lives **daily**.

In addition to making AEDs universally available, Frank's goal is to have a registered citizens' army, trained in the use of AEDs and CPR, who can respond to the nearest emergency and locate an AED if required via the "GoodSAM" app.

Frank reminded us that 5 minutes delay in the application of an AED reduces survival of a cardiac arrest by 50%; while a ten-minute delay is usually fatal.

Frank's legislation **requires compliance from** Government organisations by **01/01/2025** and is applicable for **other buildings**, **facilities and vehicles 12 months later**.



The CellAED® is a world-first in automated external defibrillator technology — a personal, single-use AED that's compact, affordable and simple to use in any home or workplace.







# THIS MONTH'S MARKET BENEFICIARY ABORIGINAL CHRONIC DISEASE PREVENTION PROJECT

This project has been developed as an enduring and worthwhile legacy to mark the Centenary of Rotary in South Australia.

The project will fund two Aboriginal PhD scholars over 3 ½ years to undertake research to establish a capability development program that supports the upskilling of an Aboriginal healthcare workforce in chronic disease prevention.

The successful candidates will work within Aboriginal communities to develop culturally appropriate models for improving health outcomes.

To deliver this important project, Rotary Adelaide, Rotary District 9510, and Australian Rotary Health are working in partnership with The School of Public Health at The University of Adelaide and the Wardliparinggi Aboriginal Health Equity team at SAHMRI.



The **Aboriginal Chronic Disease Prevention Project** is an opportunity to contribute to an enduring legacy for **future generations**.
