We were fortunate to have the spouse double act of Monica Correa Castro and Erik Lazaro Vargas for their "Behind the Badge" presentation. Monica and Erik put some effort into their visual aids which helped get us up to speed on things Mexican.

Monica kicked off. She comes from a large extended family, and they love nothing better than celebrating. When she married Erik in 2013, 80 guests attended the celebration, but she was hoping for many more.

Monica worked for global corporate giant Holcim, Mexico, working in the finance department. Monica said the hurly burly of that world taught her how to adapt, which she is now applying to her new training course of cookery.

They both moved to Australia and lived in Brisbane in 2016. After the pleasant all year-round temperature of 27C in Mexico City, Brisbane's weather was not for them. After returning to Mexico City, and upon the recommendation of a friend they decided on Adelaide as a place to live and apply for citizenship.

Erik followed Monica with his address and there was some overlap. Erik has two siblings but feels that he is closer to Monica's extended family.

Growing up Erik loved to play, but eventually graduated from Mexico's largest university, UNAM with a degree in Engineering.

Erik's first job was working in a finance centre. He also started a pharmaceutical business, which sadly failed. From 2017-2022 he worked for the French company Yves Rocher and was manager for two years.

Tragedy struck in 2020 when Erik's father died from Covid. In 2022 Monica and Erik made an extensive tour of Italy, which left a lasting impression.

Erik's extensive interests include Leadership, Personal Development, Meditation and the Editor's interpretation 'The Meaning of Life'.

While Erik determines his future he is working with Monica in hospitality at Glenelg. In addition to her studies and other jobs, Monica is also working at John Flynn's Perfect Blend (another reason to pop in for a coffee and/or meal).
