

Lindsay, Molly and Sebastian

Two previous presenters at our club made an appearance at our first meeting for the calendar year: Sebastian Cole and Molly Sweeney.

Since graduating from Norwood International High School in 2022, Sebastian worked for a year as well as coaching rowing.

Sebastian had applied to join the Army in 2022 and finally received word of his acceptance. On route to Kapooka the bus full of recruits was involved in a collision so they had to take a circumlocutory route, finally arriving after a 12-hour journey.

Sebastian was part of an experimental recruit training course that cut the training from 3 months to 9 weeks. He then was accepted into his first choice, Armoured Corp based at Puckapunyal. Initially training on armoured personnel carriers he will eventually move to variants of the Abrams tanks. Australia will be receiving 59 of these leviathans (why not 60?).

For those new to the club Sebastian and his dad, Peter, reminisced about the legendary Norwood High, Long Row of the Murray. Sebastian also briefly spoke about the honour of having Norwood International High's new rowing boats named after himself and Rowing Coach, Ben O'Connell. This was in recognition of the very significant role that Sebastian and Ben played in fundraising for the Rowing Club.


Service Above Self Award

In 2022, Norwood High International's Molly Sweeney was the recipient of our club's "Service Above Self" award and was sponsored by our club for RYLA 2023. She went on to give us an update of her progress since then.

She is currently mid-way through her degree in Oral Health, which she described as something midway between a Hygienist and a Dentist.

Her qualification will entitle her to perform limited dental work such as fillings. This year she will be working on patients with a view to graduating in 2025.

As part of the Salvation Army musical troupe Molly performed numerous Christmas gigs and was seen by some of us at playing Christmas music near Tony and Marks, Jan Street, Newton, sometimes in wind and rain (apologies to Good King Wenceslas).





REGIONALISATION:

As preparation for the Regionalisation Pilot progresses, we now have a recommendation on the new club groupings (called Rotary Community Groups)

There are likely to be 7 RCGs with 13 clubs in Group 3. This would see Magill Sunrise joining with Blackwood, Burnside, Campbelltown, Coromandel Valley, Eastwood, Edwardstown, Hyde Park, Mitcham, Morialta, Norwood, St Peters and Unley.

The new groupings took account most particularly of preferences:

- for geographic disposition
- for specific clubs you want to be grouped with
- to remain grouped with clubs in your current D9510 Areas
- for local government alignment

The exciting thing is we can collaborate within the new RCGs seeking ways to increase our impact, retain and grow membership, and build Rotary's public profile and brand.



QUIZ QUESTION

On this day, 9th January 1868, the "Hougoumont" commonly known as a Blackwall Frigate, dropped anchor at Fremantle. **What significance did this ship play in Australian history?**

Answer: The "Hougoumont" bought the last 269 convicts to Australia ending 80 years of penal transportation to Australia. Some 168,000 prisoners were sent to Australia, and the last of them, Samuel Speed, transported in 1866 died in 1938.


