GUEST SPEAKER: ALICE JOSAF



This morning our club had the pleasure of welcoming Alice Josef, a physiotherapist working in the aged care sector and a passionate supporter of AFADU and Dr Godfrey Sibanda, a director at the Lirhanzo Childrens Village in Zimbabwe, and medical practitioner here in Adelaide.

AFADU – Aid for Africa Down Under was founded in 2004 by former Chairperson, Julie Routledge, following a trip to Zimbabwe, where she

observed the poor conditions in which a group of orphaned and other vulnerable children lived in Chikombedzi, Mwenezi District, in Zimbabwe.

Alice explained that most of the children were orphaned due to the death of their parents from HIV, but some are just abandoned. Today the Lirhanzo Childrens Village, Lirhanzo meaning love in the shangaan language, supports fifty-five children. Here they are nurtured with love, given shelter, food, an education and medical attention.

Apart from the village AFADU also supports the Chikombedzi Hospital where Dr Sibanda was born.

Alice told us about the projects within the village helping to make them self-sufficient, such as the Chicken Project which provides both eggs and chickens. The Water Project which provides safe accessible drinking water, the Solar Project providing power to the water pumps and the Commercial Garden Project which provides food to the village and the surplus is sold at market to provide funds for the village.



Education is very important and AFADU believes it is this which will give the children a better chance in life. The schools which have been built in 2017, 2019 and 2023 provide education for not only those at the LCV but the local community. They have children that have now gone through to university and are able to contribute back to LCV.

Alice told us that AFADU is an Australian non-profit, non-government charitable organisation which was registered in 2004. It is also a RAWCS project.

We were told that \$80 per month covers the cost of sponsoring one of the children which includes food, education and care.

Alice ended with a quote from Audrey Hepburn,

"You have two hands: one to help yourself, the second to help others".





ABORIGINAL CHRONIC DISEASE PREVENTION PROJECT

The plan is to deliver an enduring and worthwhile legacy to mark the Centenary of Rotary in South Australia.

The specific project aims to upskill an Aboriginal healthcare workforce in chronic disease prevention.

Magill Sunrise Rotary has been able to contribute to this project with proceeds from Magill Sunrise Markets.

ICE BREAKER

ROTARY PEACE FELLOWSHIPS

Each year, Rotary awards up to 130 fully funded fellowships for peacebuilders from diverse backgrounds to study at one of our peace centres located at leading universities around the world. This year, we'll select 50 peace fellows to study in our master's degree programs at six partner universities in Asia, Australia, Europe, and the United States and 80 fellows to earn postgraduate diplomas through our professional development certificate programs at Makerere University in Uganda and Bahçeşehir University in Turkey. Rotary Peace Fellows use their training to amplify their work at the local, regional, or global level.

Candidates have until 15 May to submit applications to The Rotary Foundation.

Thanks to generous support from donors and the dedicated participation of Rotary members, the peace fellowship program has more than 1,700 alumni working to make positive change in more than 140 countries. Many program alumni have founded their own organizations to address critical issues or serve as leaders in governments, nongovernmental organizations, educational and research institutions, media and the arts, and international organizations like the United Nations and the World Bank.
