The kernel of an idea started with delivering meals to busy mums picking up their kids at school, which morphed into deliveries to home and eventually a business on Reid Avenue, Hectorville (near the junction with Fisher Street) and a staff of 12.

The mission statement of the Family Cook is best stated in a lift out from their webpage. 'Let us take care of meal prep for you! We only use premium ingredients. We love to cook with the free-range chicken & eggs, grass-fed beef, Australian fish and locally sourced vegetables and herbs. We are the only South Australian meal delivery service who offers this. We have fresh and frozen options. All our meals are ready to eat, so all you have to do is put them in the microwave and dinner is sorted in 3 minutes! Delicious 'ready to eat' meals are just a click away.

The business received a kick along from two grants from the City of Campbelltown.

Community Action for Fresh Water (CAFW) is the flagship initiative of Rotary's partnership with <u>United Nations Environment Programme</u> (UNEP). Through this initiative, Rotary and Rotaract members work with their local communities and partners to protect, restore, and sustain freshwater ecosystems in alignment with the environment area of focus. The strategic partnership between Rotary and the United Nations announced in January 2024.

This partnership works toward achieving the **UN Sustainable Development Goals**, particularly those that contribute to clean water and sanitation (number 6), climate action (number 13), and life on land (number 15).
