It was another stellar performance - hearing Bernard recall the experience of singing, acting and dancing his way across the USA during six performances, 16 workshops and with 40 selected kids from the Australian Youth Performing Arts Team (AYPAT).

First stop was Disneyworld, singing in the Candlelight Processional and at Universal Studios. Often Bernard was the featured soloist, lead dancer or Dance Captain. There were also advanced singing, dancing and acting workshops with Disney professionals and experts.

The next leg took the team to Atlanta for more workshops and to compete at the Junior Theatre Festival - the biggest Youth Festival in the world. AYPAT won an award for outstanding choreography.

And to round things off, the final leg was in New York for advanced workshops, behind the scenes tours and four Broadway shows - meeting stars, choreographers, directors and producers.

Well done Bernard! What an experience.

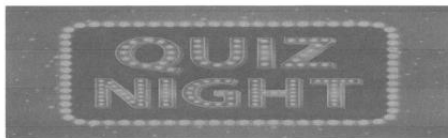
