** MAJOR PROGRAMS AND PROJECTS

Long before Regionalisation came along, Lindsay was a keen advocate for **collaborating with other clubs** AND for Rotary seeking some more **high-profile activities**. So, he's extremely proud of our Club's role in Lift The Lid Walks, Defibrillators, Domestic Violence initiatives, and more – knowing the impact has been amplified by collaboration. It also means Rotary has a significant presence in some of the most important community concerns - taking actions that raise awareness, can save lives

and do make a difference.

But there was much more to this year.

The **Magill Sunrise Market** continues to be the cornerstone of our community engagement and an excellent platform for charitable activities. It's such a great example of how to integrate social causes into community events.

The **Magill RSL Quiz Night** was outright fun – and even better when we heard about the crucial support services our funds will assist.

The **Lift The Lid Walk** helped raise mental health awareness in our community and contributed \$10,000 to mental health research.

We organised the installation of two **Peace Poles**, helping to spread the peace message among young minds locally whilst celebrating Rotary's centenary in SA.

We became a collection point for the DV Safe Phones as part of building our support for the **Rotary Says No to Domestic Violence** program.

We continued to run a very warped but highly successful **District Footy Tipping competition**.

We supported international initiatives like the **Ukraine New Dawn** project; a dental program for children in Cambodia and foresee many more opportunities to help with the education and health of children through our new connections into **Lirhanzo Children's Village**, **Zimbabwe**.

We also had Operation Flinders, Science programs, Leadership Awards and much, much more.

Club Meetings were diverse and fun.

It included some **new members** telling us their story, often taking us to far-away places like Canada and Mexico. We also had **local identities** like Justin Kahl from SAGE; Victoria Braithwaite from The Family Cook and Greg Champion telling us what he likes about football.



We also were impressed by **young people** like Bernard Flynn, Molly Sweeney, Sebastian Cole and the recent science program students.

There were many incredibly **passionate speakers** like Rosemary Cadden on her book "McDouall Stuart Hitches a Ride"; Shouwn Oosting on the "Acknowledgement to Country"; and who wasn't touched by Elizabeth Backshall's experience with epilepsy?

Finally, let's not forget the **crazy fun bits**, including setting a world record for the most people at a Rotary club meeting dancing the Macarena.


