QUIZ QUESTION

On this day 2nd July 1881 Charles Guiteau did something infamous. What was it?

ANSWER: He shot President James A. Garfield twice in Washington DC as he waited to board a train to New Jersey. One shot glanced his arm, but the second shot went through his back shattering a rib and settled in his chest. The son of Abraham Lincoln, Robert Lincoln, was near him at

the time and was very mindful of his father's assassination just 16 years earlier and extremely distressed. Garfield stoically exclaimed "My God! What is this?" and was taken to the White House where Doctors examined him. Despite the work of Joseph Lister, the Doctors treating Garfield did not believe in sanitisation, so they poked and prodded with unsanitised hands and instruments to try to remove the bullet to no avail and infection set in. Attempts to remove the bullet continued, including Alexander Graham Bell using a primitive metal detector to try to find where it was located. By the end of August Garfield had lost around 40kg in weight as the infection spread but continued to operate in a limited form as President from his bed at the White House. He continued to get worse and eventually died on the 19th of September. Vice President Chester A. Arthur was sworn in as President the following day.



Guiteau was a disgruntled member of the Republican Party who believed Garfield owed him a prestigious position for assisting him in his election, such as US Ambassador to France because he could speak French. Garfield did not deliver this and Guiteau in his delusion thought Arthur would give him this opportunity if Garfield was gone. He was wrong. He was hanged for his crime on 30th June 1882.


























LOCHEND HOUSE OPEN DAY - SUNDAY 4 AUGUST 2024

ROTARY YOUTH PROGRAM OF ENRICHMENT (2024)

For young people, aged 14-17

RYPEN is a three-day residential program of enrichment for young people aged 14 to 17.

The program aims to provide opportunities for young people to develop important life-skills, and to assist them to progress their communication and leadership skills through a range of formal and informal activities.

Participants take part in a range of activities including:

- Ice-breakers
- Comedy skits
- Discussion forums
- · Small group work Workshops
 - Career expos

Personal Development

Experienced young facilitators will support and encourage participants in the program to develop their:

- Public speaking skills
 Self-care and resilience
- Communication skills

- Teamwork
- Problem-solving Skills
- Beliefs and values
- RYPEN'S focus is on assisting young people to become active and valuable members of society, and to develop their

abilities as potential leaders. Participants can seize the opportunity to develop leadership, communication and problem-solving skills, practice

new behaviours, forge life-long friendships and challenge their personal belief systems and values.

Who is Eligible?

RYPEN is open to all young people aged 14 to 17 years who have an ambition to improve their interpersonal and leadership skills

Details in Brief

- When / Where: RYPEN is held at Nunvara Conference Centre between Fri 1 Nov and Sun 3 Nov 2024.
- . How to register: Any young person aged 14-17 can register their interest at www.rypen9510.org
- Applications are due: Monday 14 October 2024.
- RYPEN costs: Around \$425, but most young people will attend at no cost, fully sponsored by Rotary. Rotary Clubs may request a \$50 holding deposit which is fully refundable when the young person attends RYPEN.
- . School involvement: Encourage young people to apply. Once a young person registers, Rotary finds a local Rotary Club to sponsor the applicant.
- . Rotary involvement: Based on each applicant's registration details, their local Rotary Club will contact the student directly. The club may interview the applicant and ask to interview the applicant.
- Child Protection: RYPEN facilitators are aged between 19 and 24, have attended Rotary leadership training. have their Working With Children Check (WWCC) and have been vetted for suitability by Rotary.
