## RISK MANAGEMENT – “KEEPING US SAFE”

Essential to the successful running of our Rotary club is the availability of public liability insurance for our activities. Facilitated by our District Insurance Officer (DIO) ensuring public liability cover is provided for approved activities through Rotary’s insurers, we conduct thorough risk assessments at committee level prior to our events, followed by compiling safety check lists and completing the relevant Insurance Declaration proforma we ensure the DIO approves public liability insurance for our

events.

Our risk assessments typically include analysis of work equipment safety such as our BBQs, gas bottles and the donut fryer, and work-space analysis including potential trip hazards, electrical safety and food safety.

Of particular note is that stallholders, food vendors and other 3<sup>rd</sup> parties that attend our events are not covered by the Rotary public liability insurance but instead must provide evidence of suitable public liability insurance that they have obtained themselves.

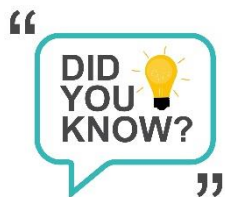

Our pole has the message of peace in English, Kurna, Hindi an Auslan.





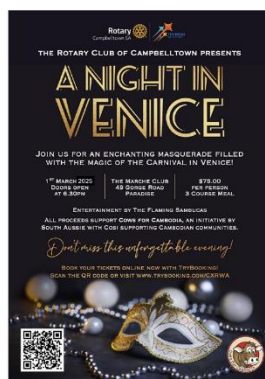
## "A NIGHT IN VENICE" - 01 March 25

Farmers across SA, particularly in the mid-North region, are in desperate straits trying to source enough feed for their Sheep, Cattle, Horses and more.

*Food is running out! Animals are starving. Suffering. Dying. The drought has hit hard!*

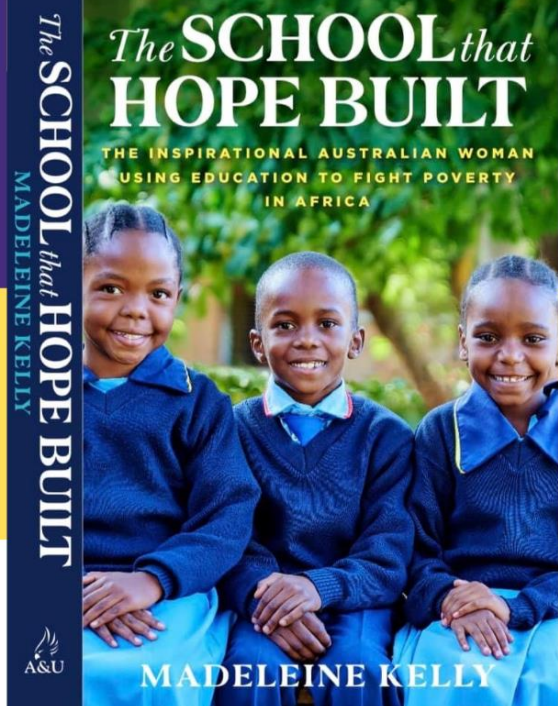

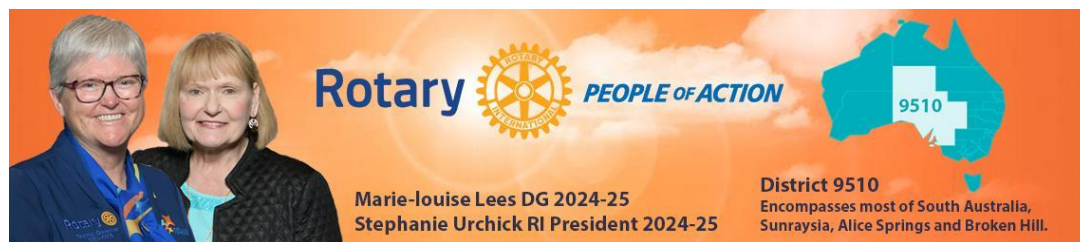
