GUEST SPEAKER: SUZETTE COAT



Prior to Suzette giving us an update on the Zimbabwe international project it was lovely to be able to present Suzette with her engraved “Rotarian of the Year” award 2024-2025 and the new perpetual “Mina Ward Trophy”.

Our presenter this week was club member Suzette Coat. Suzette presented an update on our international project.

Our project is to build a house for teachers at Lirhanzo Children’s Village in Mwenezi, Zimbabwe.

Suzette reminded us that the project goal is \$20,000. Our progress so far has been sluggish, with a total of \$3,463 having been raised so far.

We got to see the Zimbabwe Government approved architect drawing of the planned structure.

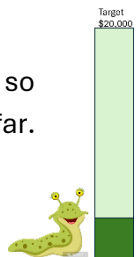
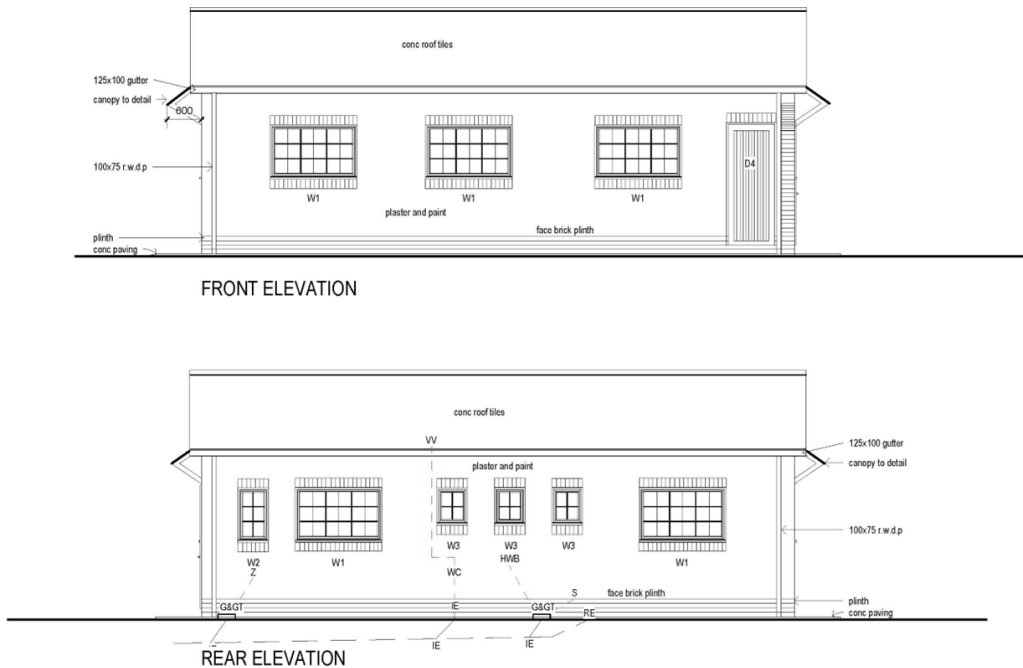


Figure 1: Elevation drawings of the planned house for 3 teachers.

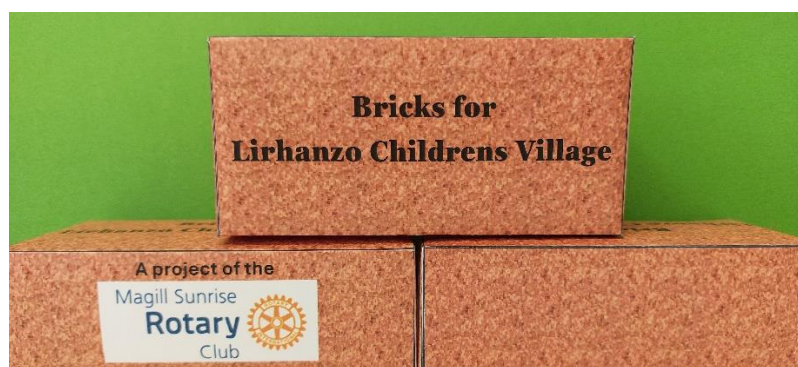
Orders open this week and delivery will be at our August 10th market. Grab an order form at the market on Sunday and submit it to Suzette before 01 August.

ZIMBABWEAN FLAG

The Zimbabwe flag adopted on the 18APR1980 symbolises the struggles and sacrifices of the Zimbabwean people against colonialism. It consists of seven even horizontal stripes of green, gold, red and black with a white triangle containing a red five-pointed star with a Zimbabwe Bird.

- black stripe - for the black majority.
- red stripe - blood spilled during the armed struggle.
- yellow stripe - the country's mineral wealth.
- green stripe - the vegetation and agriculture.
- white triangle - peace.
- red star - the nation's aspirations.
- yellow bird - the national emblem.

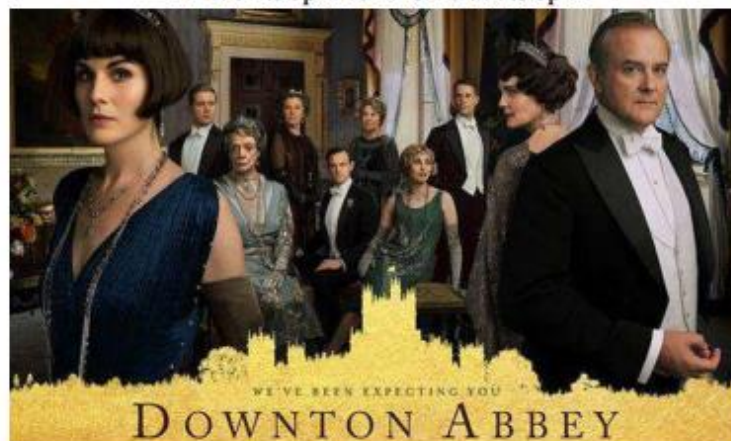
