



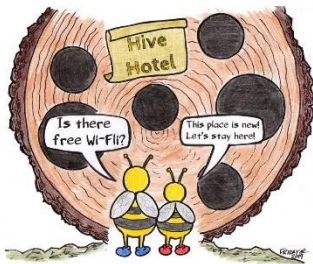

GUEST SPEAKERS: Dr KATJA HOGENDOORN



This week's guest speaker was Dr Katja Hogendoorn, a senior researcher at the University of Adelaide's School of Agriculture, Food and Wine.

Her research focuses on the maintenance and enhancement of bees as pollinators of crops and native plants.

At a more general level, she is interested in ecology and evolution, behaviour, taxonomy and conservation of bees.

Katja uses her understanding of bee behaviour to inform management decisions for the improvement of bee health, biodiversity, and crop pollination services – and in her spare time, contributes to the public appreciation of urban biodiversity.

Katja left Holland and arrived in Australia with family in 1996. Although expert on European bees she knew nothing about the Australian varieties. One of her mantra's 'out of love comes care' caught our attention and Katja went on to explain her love affair with bees.



European bees were introduced into Australia in the 1820s as a means of pollinating apple trees. While out walking we often see bees clumped together in trees. These are not native bees, but European bees that are feral; they compete with native bees, bats, birds and other wildlife. It is estimated that there are 2.5 thousand species of native bees, but less than two thousand have been classified, with around 100 in the Adelaide area. Half of the native bees gravitate to eucalyptus as a food source, but there are a number of food sources for them. One native has been described as a 'flying paint brush' because of the way that it distributes canola pollen.

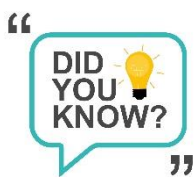
Seventy percent of native bees nest in the hard ground, with the remainder building nests in or on twigs and holes in trees. Katja went on to describe in detail how these above ground nests are made, some with intricate entrances that prevent ants and predators from entering. Except for one species, all Australian bees are solitary. They can nest together in a group, but in separate 'apartments'. The leaf cutter bee makes a 'sleeping bag' from the piece of leaf that it has cut and then lays its eggs in it and seals it.

Katja explained how to make 'bee hotels'. These can be made from bamboo shoots or by drilling holes in hard wood (max 10 cm). Interestingly if the holes are drilled in a regular pattern, then the bees can become lost and cannot find their apartment; better to have random/irregular holes. The hotels must be left near a bee food source and high enough to avoid predatory ants. Katja reminded us that you can't have a hotel without a 'restaurant'. Beekeeping is one of the oldest recorded means of food production. But do you know the first beekeepers of the world weren't 'keepers' at all; they were instead foragers of wild honey.

The Cueva de la Araña caves near Valencia, Spain, bears the earliest beekeeping evidence. It houses a Mesolithic rock painting dating to 9000 BCE. The cave painting depicts a human figure climbing a tree to gather honey from a beehive.

The practice of domesticated beekeeping developed in ancient Egypt around 2500 BCE.

one guest shared that back in England her mum used to make a special mixture of raw egg (whisked), milk and sugar!

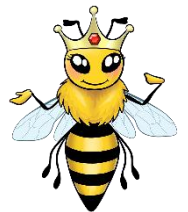


Quiz Question
