**GUEST SPEAKER: JEFF NEALE**



This week’s guest speaker was no stranger to our club, in the person of honorary member, Jeff Neale. Past DG Jeff has worn many rotary hats, which is appropriate as one of his topics was ‘Lifting the Lid’.

Maybe CJ Dennis would have said, ‘I dips me lid’. Jeff is now District 9510’s Director for Australian Rotary Health (ARH).

ARH is a rotary program that falls under the control of Australian District Governors and not Rotary International. The current CEO, Joy Gillett will be standing down soon after 40 years of service. There are 11 board members with Prof Michael Sawyer as a special contributor.

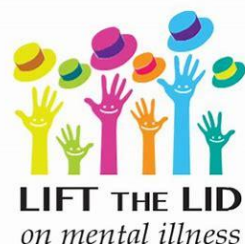
ARH began in 1981 with Ian Scott wanting to raise \$2M into finding an answer to Sudden Infant Death Syndrome (SIDS). Australia, and more so Tasmania then had the highest incidence of SIDS in the western world and thanks to the work of Ian, the research produced an 80% reduction in SIDS in Australia with a flow on around the world.

Since 1985 \$55M has been donated to the ARH. The ARH focuses on 4 areas, Research on General Health and Mental Health as well as Scholarships for Indigenous Health and Rural Medical and Nursing. J

Jeff then spoke in more detail on Mental Health, saying that research is now focusing on the aged group, nought to twelve. Money raised at the “Lift the Lid” on the 9<sup>th</sup> November will contribute to this research.

Jeff encouraged us to continue donating to The Rotary Foundation in addition to ARH. For more information on ARH click onto <https://australianrotaryhealth.org.au/>

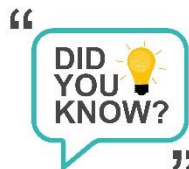
