Thanks to everyone for their input and hopefully we can put a bit of zing back into our monthly event.

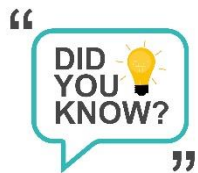

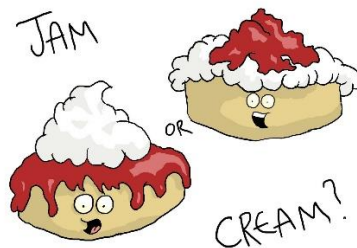
## Icebreaker

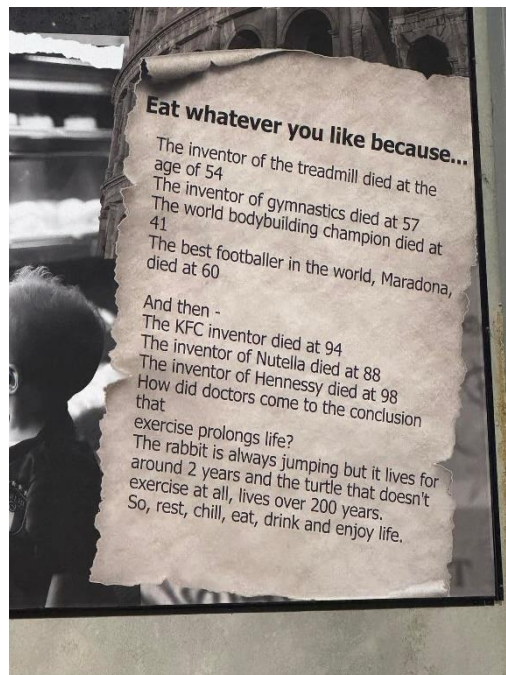

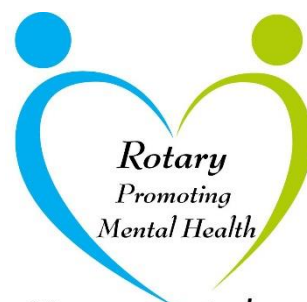

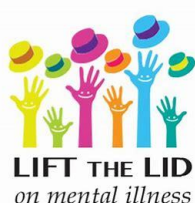
