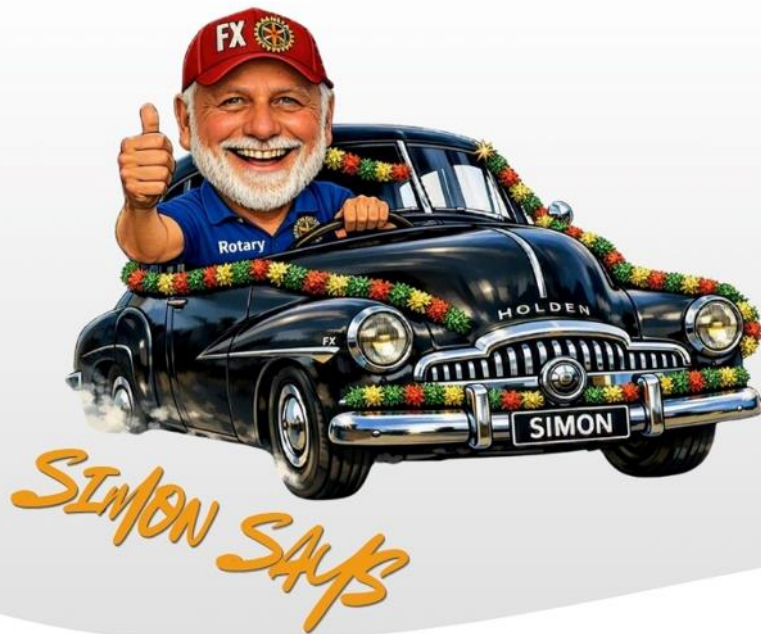

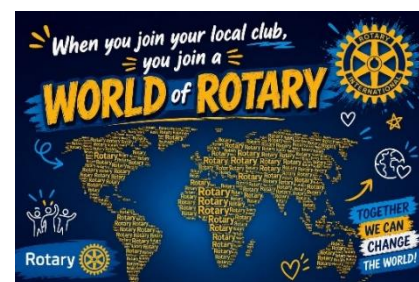

GUEST SPEAKER: KRIS JAMES – Adelaide Electrical Salvage



Kris James delivered a compelling and energetic presentation on his rapidly growing social and environmental impact venture, **Adelaide Electrical Salvage**, an appliance repair, e-waste recycling and second-hand spare parts business with a bold mission: **to eliminate e-waste entirely**.

His mantra – **Recover, Repair, Recycle** – underpins every aspect of the operation.

Kris explained how Adelaide Electrical Salvage rescues discarded appliances, safely disassembles them, and recovers high-quality components that are then sold through an online store now exceeding 3,000 listed parts.

By making repairs affordable and accessible, the business is reducing cost-of-living pressures while diverting tonnes of e-waste from landfill.

He also highlighted his strong collaboration with **iFixit**, creating detailed step-by-step repair guides that empower people to fix items themselves and build confidence in a repair culture.

Kris spoke proudly about his work at the **Campbelltown Repair Café**, where volunteers sit with community members to repair items together. This hands-on learning dramatically shifts attitudes from “throw it out” to “maybe it can be fixed”.

The Repair Café’s partnership with the **Magill Rotary Market** continues to amplify this impact across the community.

Kris’s long-term vision is a fully fledged community repair hub—an accessible space where people can learn, repair and reuse with ease.

Contact Lindsay if you would like to join us at the **9:00am** ceremony on **Friday 4th September 2026** as the College students help promote peace in thought, word, and action.





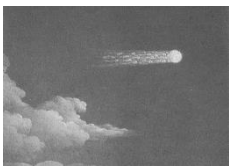
PRESIDENT'S DID YOU KNOW?

Strange & Curious Facts About Today in History

In the second half of the 18th century two significant events occurred on this day. In 1769 lightning struck a fortress in Brescia, Italy igniting 90 tons of gunpowder, which devastated the town and killed around 3,000 people. It is one of the deadliest non-nuclear explosions ever recorded.

Fourteen years later a huge fireball meteor crossed the skies over Great Britain, where people thought it was the end of the world. It was so bright that witnesses reported being able to read by its light. The object travelled hundreds of kilometres across the sky before breaking apart. What makes this event remarkable is who observed it:

- The astronomer William Herschel who later discovered Uranus recorded it.
- The artist Thomas Gainsborough sketched it.
- Future King George IV, then Prince of Wales, saw it.
- Thousands of ordinary Britons described the spectacle in letters and diaries.



At the time, scientists still argued about whether "shooting stars" were atmospheric phenomena or objects from space. The 1783 fireball became one of the most thoroughly documented meteor events of the 18th century and helped advance the scientific understanding of meteors.

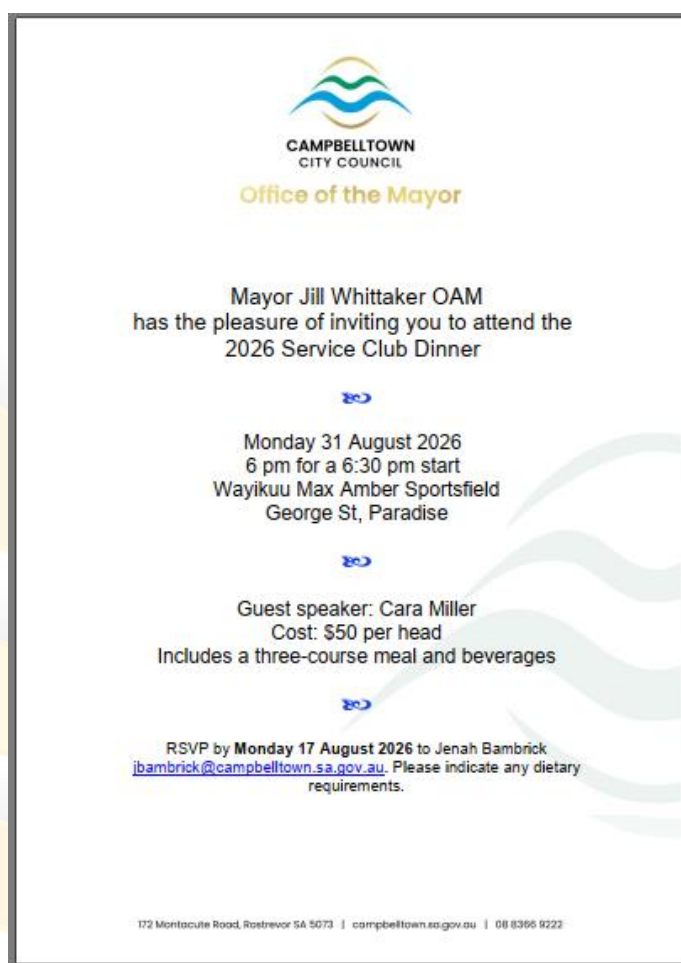
